About This Report

The United Nations "Transforming our World: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development" which includes the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) has great importance and significance to universities. The SDGs provide for a shared global vision towards sustainable development for all. Vishwakarma University (VU) firmly believes in the vital role that universities can play in the achievement of the SDGs, and has ingrained this aspect in all of its strategies and operations. As encapsulated in its motto - maximizing human potential, VU, since the year of its inception, has worked endlessly towards creating an enabling environment to ensure the wholesome development of its students - preparing them for life and livelihood.

VU has embarked on an exciting journey to transform the VU Campus to become an EcoCampus, which will be a testbed for innovative sustainability solutions for the future. The vision of the VU EcoCampus is to develop VU as "a global Sustainability thought leader, committed to contributing towards improving society, by providing an empowering partnership for the development of technology and educating the future generation". Sustainability with an aim to reduce the carbon footprint was the key theme of the function organised to celebrate the launch of the 'Eco Campus'.

This report showcases VU's commitment to the UN Sustainable Development Goals in which VU has been actively working in partnership with diverse stakeholders. One such example is VU's Certificate Programme in Sustainability Management in Cooperation with the Hof University of Applied Sciences Germany, a program in which students gain a deep understanding of state-of-the-art business management techniques and more importantly latest sustainable practices. Likewise, the Wilo Foundation- Vishwakarma University established through a grant from the Wilo Foundation, Germany promotes research in water treatment, purification and creates the much-needed social awareness about clean drinking water through its Water Quality Centre of Excellence.

Last year, for the first time in its history, VU published SDG reports under its Sustaibilibity mission which outlined the key initiatives undertaken by the Institute to meet the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in 2019. This report provides a summary of the range of activities undertaken at VU during 2020 to meet the SDGs through its teaching, research, outreach and public engagement, and operations. VU conducts a diverse range of activities across the Institute, and this report showcases some of the many such initiatives. In spite of being severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, VU continually strives to implement sustainability in all its core operations, including by creating a platform to showcase its efforts toward the SDGs in a comprehensive and detailed manner.

VU participated for the first time in the Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings 2021, which looks at global universities' commitment and performance in furthering the SDGs. VU was ranked amongst the top 100-200 in the world for SDG7– Clean and Affordable Energy. The achievement is a recognition of VU's work in providing education to students from countries where energy crises are an issue. Likewise, VU ranked top 300 in the world for SDG6– Clean Water and Sanitation which indicates a recognition of our education and research on water issues. 1,118 universities from 94 countries participated in this ranking exercise, which also saw VU's work recognized on several other SDG's.

VU continually strives to contribute to the sustainable development of the nation and society at large by developing educated and productive human resources that observe and adhere to the practices of equity, inclusiveness, excellence, ethics, and professional standards.

VU's Participation in the THE Impact Rankings 2021

Vishwakarma University (VU) participated for the first time in the Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings, which looks at global universities' commitment and performance in furthering the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). 1,118 universities from 94 countries participated in the ranking by submitting input during 2019, and the results were published on April 22, 2021, with VU ranked amongst top 100-200 in the world for SDG7 - Clean and Affordable Energy.



VU took part in the 4 SDGs listed below plus the mandatory SDG17, and the results were as follows:

VU has signed MoUs with international universities and institutes helping students to explore diverse environments and various cultures across the globe. VU has an active bilateral semester exchange program with multiple universities, for example, 12 students from VU are pursuing research internships at Kasetsart University, Thailand and 12 students from Kasetsart are pursuing research internships at VU. Students and faculty are connected with peers in Europe, USA, Asia, Canada, Middle East, and Africa.

The engagement between VU and Nanyang Technological University (NTU) is another example. VU is the only Indian university to enter into such a unique gift alliance with one of Singapore's leading technological universities. The Fellowship fund has supported VU faculty members' capacity development and collaborations with their peers at NTU Singapore in different domains, including art and design, journalism, engineering, technology, and management. VU faculty engage with their NTU counterparts, sharing the best practices in teaching and learning and the latest developments in research and innovation. This collaborative approach between the faculty members of both universities has strengthened VU faculty's teaching and research capabilities and ultimately enhanced their student's learning experience.

Academic collaborations with international universities have been developed to establish Two-Stage Degree Programmes wherein part of the programme is conducted at VU and other at the partner foreign university. VU plans to establish a student semester exchange programme and initiate a summer internship for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Students.

VU hosted its first International Symposium on Innovation and Collaboration in 2019 and the Lakshminarayana Global Music Festival consecutively in 2020 and 2021. The University has established the Design Thinking and Innovation Center of Excellence in collaboration with SUNY Binghamton University, New York, USA to create and teach about design thinking and problem-solving frameworks. VU has partnered with the Asian Institute of Technology (AIT), Thailand and the Global Sanitation Graduate School, IHE Delft, Netherlands to launch programs focusing on water and sanitation issues. <u>https://www.vupune.ac.in/academicsss/m-sc-waste-water-and-sanitation-management</u>

A center dedicated to Water and Sanitation aspects with the Wilo foundation is operational at VU addressing SDG 6, and the Eco Campus Initiative is primarily focused on SDG 7, and various projects have been carried out in association with Integrated Environmental Solutions (IES).

VU has provided Training to MIG (Mahesh Industrial Group) members on Design Thinking to sensitize industry people of the MIG group imbibing a systematic process about design thinking and innovation. Several international speaker series were also conducted for students. VU organized higher education opportunity abroad awareness sessions for students with DAAD - Germany Information and awareness session, France Higher Studies opportunities session and workshop on Higher-Order Problem Solving for School students.

The VU has launched its 'VU Centre of Communication for Development (VUCCD), on the occasion of the country's Independence Day. The aim of the Centre is to report on marginalised communities and success stories of their struggles through print, electronic, and social media (<u>http://vuccd.com</u>).

The new centre is an important step that would provide opportunities to the students and faculty to take up assignments in media and government and non-government agencies engaged in social research. The VU CCD which is housed in the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication at VU trains the students to use print, electronic, and social media and to work as Media professionals.

VU is the first Indian university to initiate teaching, research, and application of a new discipline of Empowerment Communication. The main motto of the activity is to strengthen the role of communication in the development of the society at large and redefine the contour of development, bringing people at the center of the development process. Several stories have been reported and covered on different platforms.
