## VU Legal Aid Clinic and VU Pro Bono Club

### A. About

Vishwakarma University, Pune was established as a State Private University through the Maharashtra Government Act in the year 2017 and carries the educational legacy of the Vishwakarma Group of Institutions spanning around 40 years. The Department of Law was established under the Faculty of Law in 2018 as a center for legal research and education. The department runs PhD, LLM, LLB and BBA-LLB programmes. VU Legal Aid Clinic is a pro-bono legal services clinic established under the Department of Law according to the mandates of the Bar Council of India through which we provide legal advice, aid, assistance, and awareness.

VU Legal Aid Clinic has been actively carrying out the work of spreading legal aid and legal literacy to the vulnerable section of society. We have conducted activities like national-level seminars and workshops, lok adalat visits, street play, village camp, jansunwai, sensitization on cybercrimes for adolescents and so on. VU Legal Aid Clinic also won the Best All India Legal Aid Clinic Student Lawyer Team award and a cash prize of Rs. 10,000/- in the National Level Legal Aid Competition organized by NLSIU, Bangalore and the Department of Justice, Government of India under the DISHA (Designing Innovative Solutions for Holistic Access to Justice) Scheme.



VU Legal Aid Clinic is committed to instilling the values of social accountability among the students through providing pro bono legal aid services.

Owing to these initiatives, the VU Legal Aid Clinic was selected to be a part of the Nyaya Bandhu Scheme, Pro Bono Club Scheme of the Department of Justice, Ministry of Law and Justice, Government of India in August 2023.

### **B. Identify and engage with local stakeholder (policy if any)**

Chapter IV of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 enumerates the persons who are entitled to free legal services. As, the Legal Aid Clinic functions under the aegis of the National Legal Services Authority, we are committed to provide the services to these persons. Also, as far as the targeted population is concerned, the clinic targets vulnerable sections like women, children and elderly from the villages that are adopted by VU under the Unnat Bharat Mission and the Urban Slums around the campus of the university.

### **C. Meaningful mechanism for participation**

The clinic conducts various outreach programs which facilitate direct engagement with marginalized individuals, providing legal assistance, information, and empowerment while addressing their specific legal needs. The clinic is also open in the office hours. Anyone can call or visit the clinic for free legal advice. Our helpline number is +91 8669908315.

### **D. Research and Advice to the government**

The clinic has initiated research project with the Centre for Police Research and the proposal is under consideration. Also, we have initiated a project on 'Cyber Safety for Adolescents' after our experiences in the speed mentoring sessions that we conducted in the schools.

### **E. Neutral Platform for dialogue to come together and discuss issues frankly**

Under Constitutional guidelines, free legal aid should be available to everyone irrespective of their vulnerabilities due religions, race, case, gender, place of birth, ethnicity etc. Law students and professionals at the clinic prioritize confidentiality, creating a safe space for individuals to openly discuss their legal concerns without fear of judgment or reprisal. This impartiality fosters trust and encourages individuals to seek assistance, making VU Legal Aid Clinic a reliable and open forum for addressing a wide range of legal issues with honesty and transparency.

### **F. Activities**

#### **1. One-Day Youth Training of the Trainers Workshop on Legal Literacy and awareness**

This was organized by VU Legal Aid Clinic in Association with DoJ, Ministry of Law and Justice, Gol and CEERA, NLSIU Bengaluru on 6th May 2023 in VU Campus.

## 2. Volunteering In Lok Adalat, Sivaji-Nagar District Court, Pune MH

The event was organized by the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) to support alternative dispute resolution mechanisms and alleviate the burden on the formal court system. Twenty-two students from Vishwakarma University participated in the Lok Adalat held at Pune District Court. The students began their engagement on August 21, 2023, with an orientation session at the DLSA office. Divided into six groups and assigned to various courts, they were involved in searching for pending cases, drafting summons, and organizing court proceedings. These tasks gave them practical insights into the functioning of the legal system and the importance of alternative dispute resolution (ADR) methods. On September 9, 2023, the Lok Adalat saw 75 panels handling a large volume of cases, with 53,512 litigants participating in disputes ranging from motor accident claims to domestic violence cases. Specifically, 98,148 pre-litigation cases and 25,000 traffic violation cases were heard, demonstrating the massive scale of this initiative.

The students' active involvement was instrumental in ensuring the smooth operation of the Lok Adalat, which not only facilitated speedy resolution of cases but also provided an efficient platform for justice. The experiential learning opportunity enhanced the students' understanding of ADR mechanisms, emphasizing the role of such methods in promoting justice, reducing court backlog, and providing a quicker and more amicable settlement of disputes.





### 3. Cyber-Awareness Sessions in Schools (Speed-Mentoring)

The First-year students from Vishwakarma University conducted cyber-awareness sessions at (i) Madhav Sadashiv Golwalkar Guruji Vidyalaya on 2nd September 2023 at Madhav Sadashiv Golwalkar Guruji Vidyalaya, Tilak Road, Pune for 5th to 7th Std.

(ii) Wisdom World School (Wakad), Pune on 29th November, 2023

(iii) Dhruv Global School, Undri on 6th November, 2023

The initiative aimed to promote cyber safety among young students and raise awareness about various cyber-crimes, fostering a safer and more informed digital environment for them. The sessions were conducted in Marathi, making the content accessible to the students, and were followed by an educational skit performed in Hindi. The skit addressed important concepts such as cyber-bullying, online fraud, stalking, phone addiction, and different types of cyber-crimes. The students not only learned about these issues but were also informed about the legal consequences and punishments associated with cyber-crimes, explained in a creative and relatable manner.

## Vishwakarma University Centre for Communication for Development (VUCCD)

### A. About

The VU Centre of Communication for Development (VU CCD) was established on the 73rd Independence Day, August 15, 2020, at Vishwakarma University's Department of Journalism and Mass Communication to conduct research and teach students in Development and Empowerment Communication. This is the first Indian institution to educate, develop, and apply a new field called Empowerment Communication. VU CCD is an endeavour to conceptualize grassroots development and empowerment communication while also initiating participatory action research. Our goal is to shift the attention away from androcentric development and empowerment communication and toward gender-sensitive theories and models in the sector.

We are a team of academics, students, researchers, practitioners, activists, and grassroots workers.

Vishwakarma University Centre for Communication for Development (VUCCD) highlights various initiatives aligned with Sustainable Development Goal 16 (SDG 16), focusing on promoting peaceful and inclusive societies. Here's a summary of the key projects and activities related to SDG 16 as outlined in the report:

### Project Jagruti: Community Engagement Initiative

(September 2023-December 2023)

**Objective:** Aimed at raising awareness about government welfare schemes among villagers in Pune district through short informational videos.

**Approach:** Students created and distributed 21 videos to Gram Panchayats, helping villagers access essential information on schemes directly impacting their welfare.

**Challenges:** Issues included identifying relevant schemes and ensuring content was concise enough for the two-minute video format.

**Impact:** Improved access to information, empowered local governance, increased awareness of social welfare schemes, and strengthened community engagement with local institutions.

## 2. VU-Saksham Financial Literacy Campaign

**Objective:** Conducted in collaboration with SEBI, this campaign focused on educating rural women in Pune about financial literacy to prevent exploitation by Ponzi schemes and encourage sound investment in government welfare schemes.

**Key Activities:** The campaign reached 60 women in the villages of Donaje and Mordari, educating them on safer financial practices and sustainable investment avenues.

**Impact:** Women gained knowledge on investment options beyond traditional saving methods, contributing to their empowerment and financial independence.

### Reporting Drive

The Center for Communication for Development organized a reporting campaign with the goal of strengthening institutions and providing justice to ordinary individuals by bringing their work to the attention of audiences. Students studied the stories of rural constitutional bodies and non-state actors' contributions to robust institutions.

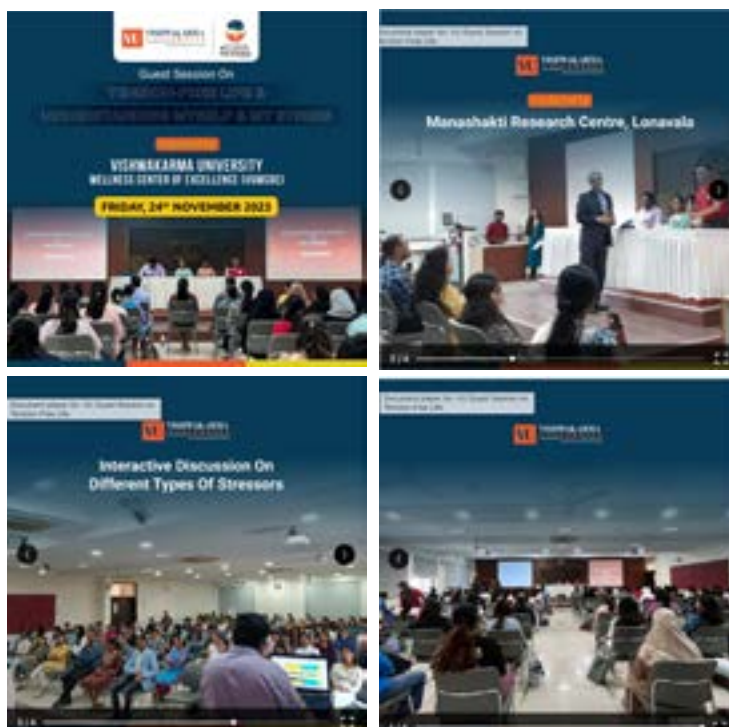
